The Normal that Never Was. How some things coincide is sometimes remarkable. I had long admired Gabor Maté, the Canadian physician and psychiatrist who had been rescued from the Holocaust as an infant, and became one of the world's greatest experts on addiction and trauma. I had long intended to read his book, <u>In the Realm of Hungry Ghosts: Close Encounters with Addiction</u>. His insights into the societal causes of personal trauma and addiction came through clearly in some interviews and lectures I saw; I wanted more.

But there is so much to read, so little time. Like Riane Eisler's <u>The Chalice and the Blade: Our History, Our Future</u>, which sat on my shelf for years, then suddenly realized that I must read it now, I knew I needed to read more by Gabor Maté too long before I actually did. When I finally read Eisler's The *Chalice and the Blade*, it was a revelation on the role of the dominator culture in Western Civilization and its implications for everyday life and politics today. Now that I've started reading Gabor Maté's latest book, a similar thing is happening. And, it is directly related to that same dominator culture.

Intellectual symbiosis can be fun. But in this case it is getting personal. When I heard about Maté's latest book, I had a feeling I should read it now and I bought it. Just as I was beginning to read <u>The Myth of Normal: Trauma, Illness, and Healing in a Toxic Culture</u>, I found myself in my own medical semi-emergency. The Myth of Normal is focused, as the subtitle suggests, on the societal sources of much illness and the related sources of failure in medicine as a profession,

despite its major technical innovations and achievements in some dimensions. Regarding the so-called 'diseases of modernity,' high blood pressure, stress, heart disease, obesity, ulcers, diabetes, etc., modern medicine tends to treat the symptoms and often fails miserably dealing with the causes. That is improving, but far too slowly.

The story is a bit different regarding the more mechanical health problems and related medical techniques and tools. The technology and methods of surgery, for example, rely more on a combination of knowledge of both biochemistry and the fine components of anatomy, as well as the physics and microelectronics of industrial design. New minimally invasive technologies, such as laparoscopic surgery, allow minimal blood loss, less damage to soft tissue, and faster recovery. New mechanical methods of repairing bone damage as well as replacement with sophisticated 'replacement parts' such as the titanium hip I received several years ago when my right hip joint simply wore out, result in the patient being up and walking, at first with a walker, and in a few days, good as new.

So, with much of my active life behind me—high school football, gymnastics, years of martial arts, as well as years of running and a lifetime of avid bicycle riding with only a few falls— not surprisingly some parts have worn significantly. Everyone at my age seems to have some back problem. Mine flared up rather severely recently. I was having a lot of lumbar pain after too much heavy lifting; I could barely walk. A remarkably talented pain specialist ordered an MRI on both my lumbar and cervical spine, since I had been getting tingling in my arms all the way down to my fingertips.

Well, as it turns out, severe cervical damage was the real threat, since the impingements on the spinal cord could cause permanent paralysis if I were to experience a serious impact (auto accident, etc.)—not an active lifestyle. You need surgery right away, the risks are too high, Dr. Raiten said as he carefully explained the details as I looked at the MRI image. So, off we go to one of the highest ranking spine centers in the country at UCLA, hoping to get in as soon as possible. I have to wonder whether their operations are yet affected by the political demolition derby operated by DOGE.

Well, all this may mean a less frequent publication of this <u>newsletter</u>, my <u>blog</u>, and my <u>Substack</u> posts for a while. Only time will tell. I'll keep up as well as I can. The good news for me is that spinal surgery techniques and technology have advanced so much in recent years. Some areas of medicine have reached amazing successes. Surgery is one, along with genetics and vaccines development. In any case, life is inherently risky.

To the extent that the practice of medicine is driven by science instead of old fashion symptom suppression, success is often the result. When surgery succeeds, it is because the technology and the cause, as well as the surgeon's skill, are so closely aligned to the symptoms and their causes. With high blood pressure and diabetes, the causes are often found outside the body, more related to what Gabor Maté refers to as our "toxic culture."

Unfortunately, the development of industrial civilization contained such toxic elements from the start. However, its trajectory has recently produced ever-increasing inequities, but even more important, the 'immiseration' of the majority of the people as a result of increasing levels of inequality caused by growing tendencies toward authoritarian rule. The Trump-Musk autocratic attempt—the outcome of which we cannot really predict—is taking this dangerous trend to its extreme.

That made an immense difference in his understanding of health and disease, and their sources in the modern world.

The fact that we do live in a toxic culture goes against the grain of medical and political thought. No, the forces driving the current market chaos are the exact same forces (in overdrive) that have been detrimental to human health and wellbeing for many decades. To understand the modern malaise, one of the best ways is to read *The Myth of Normal*.
